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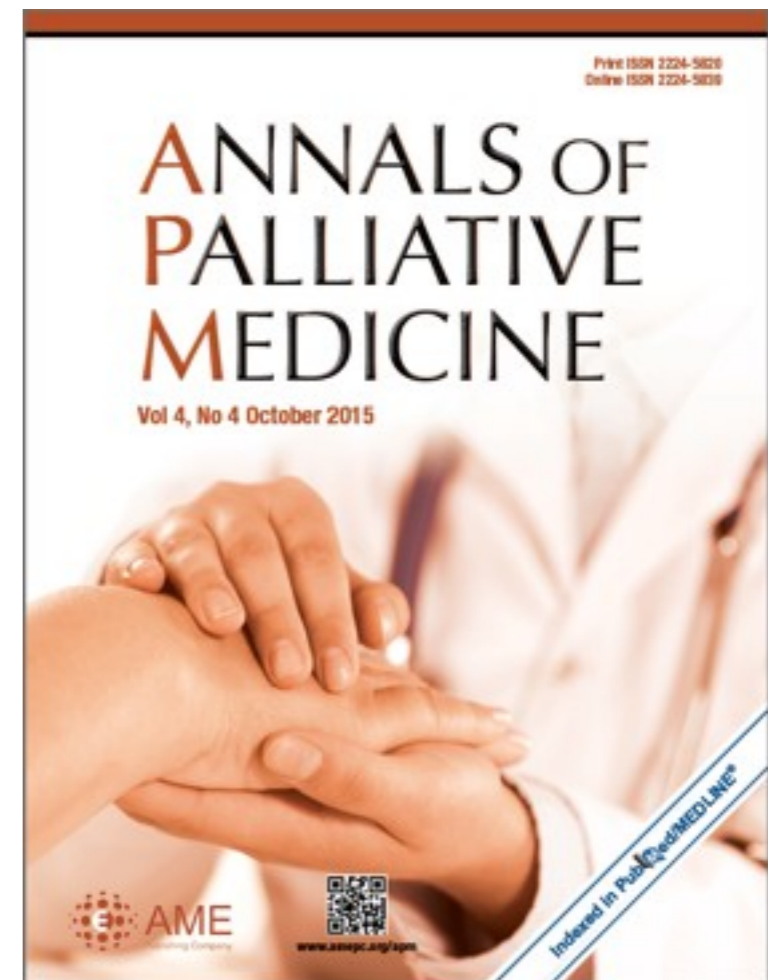

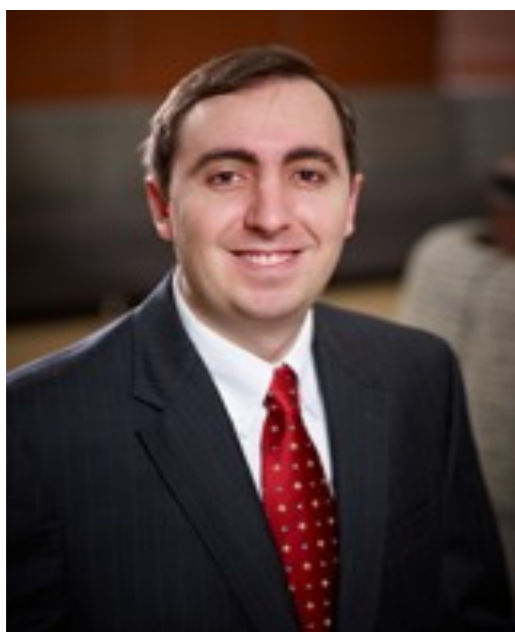



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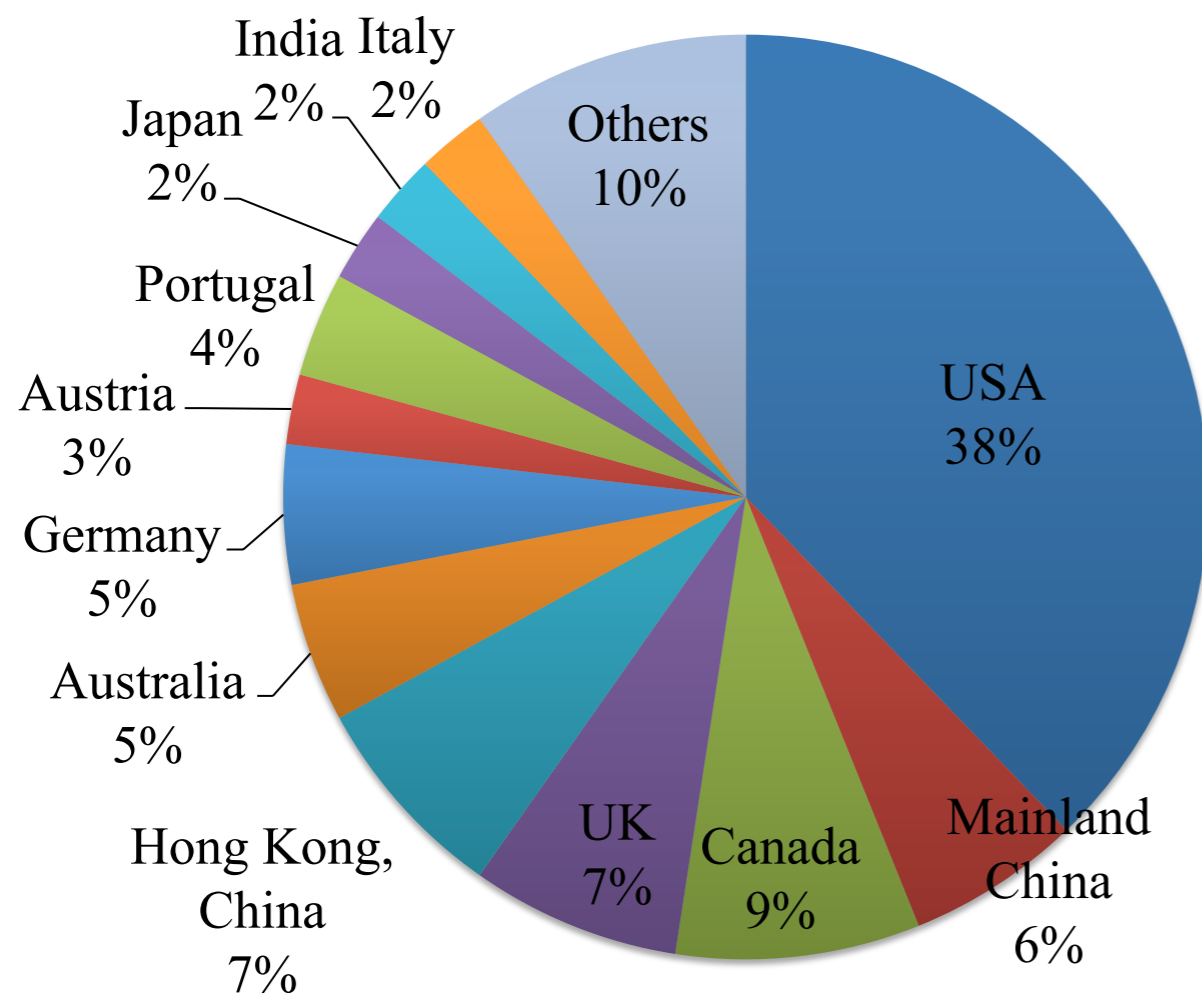


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4. Distribution of Editorial Board Members

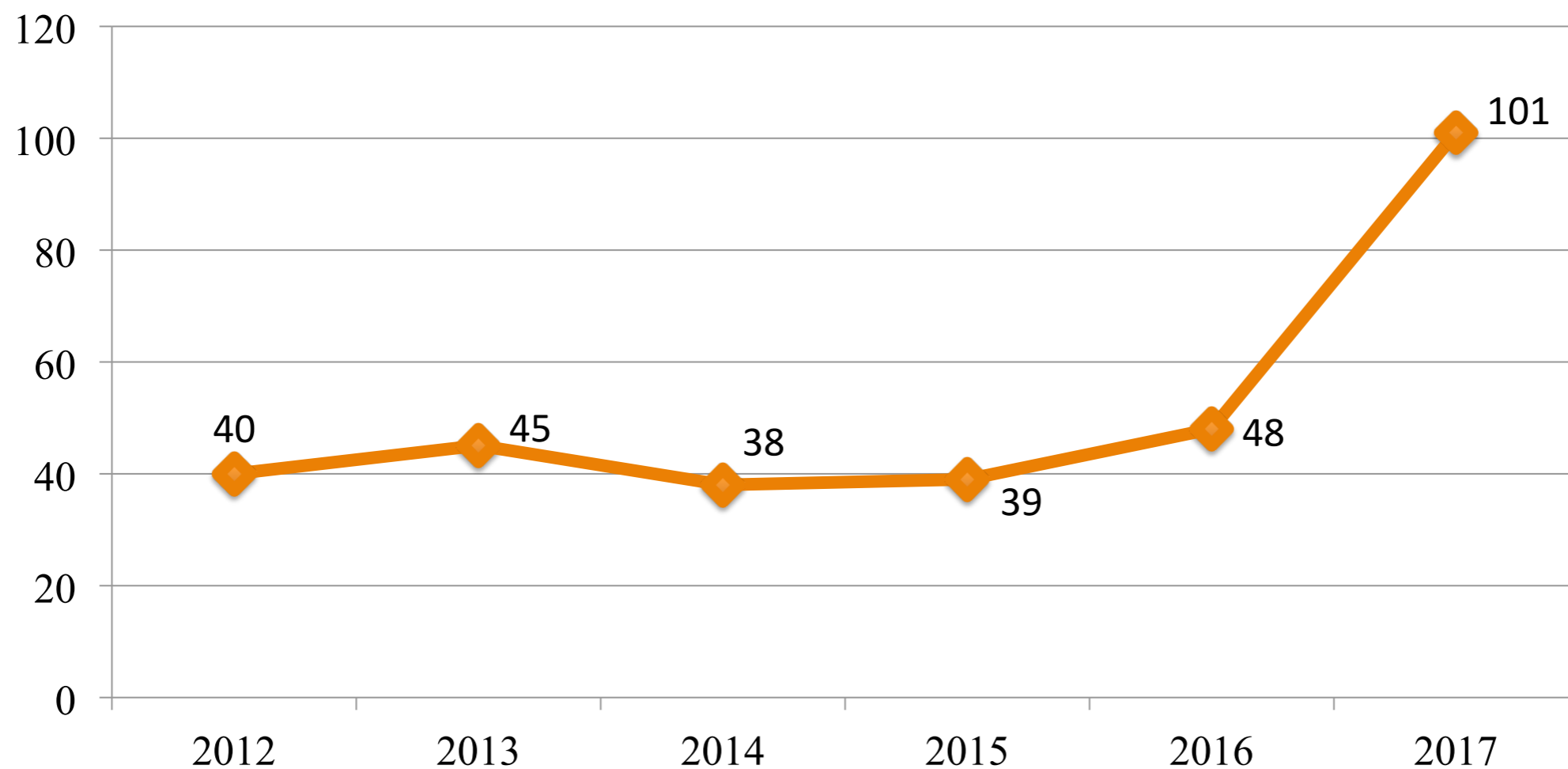


APM has **82** Editorial Board Members from **20** countries/regions. Among them, 38% from USA, 9% from Canada and 7% from UK etc.

10% Others include Singapore, Norway, Poland, Northern Ireland, Lebanon, Egypt, Brazil and Belgium.

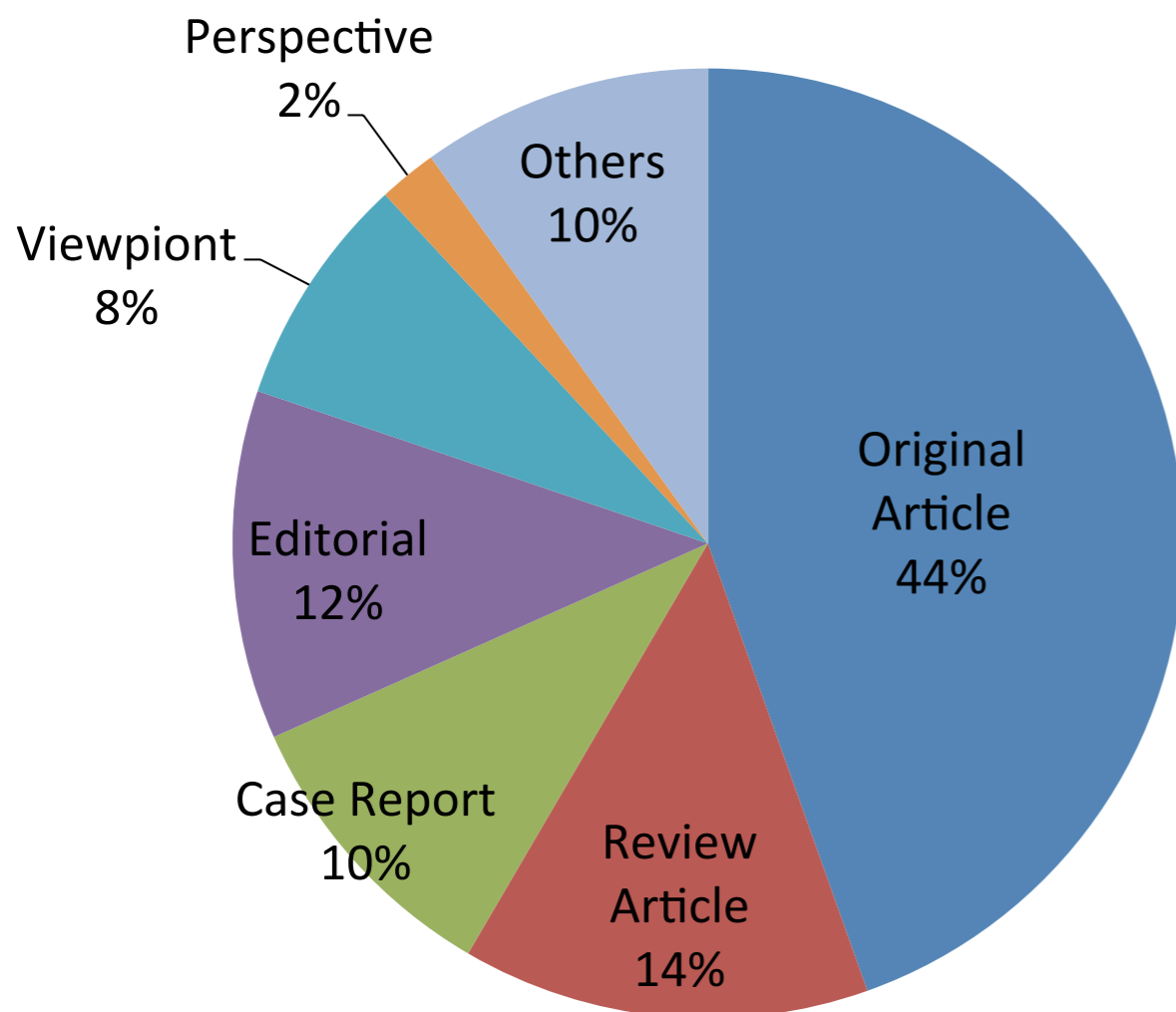

6. Diverse Types of Articles Published in 2017

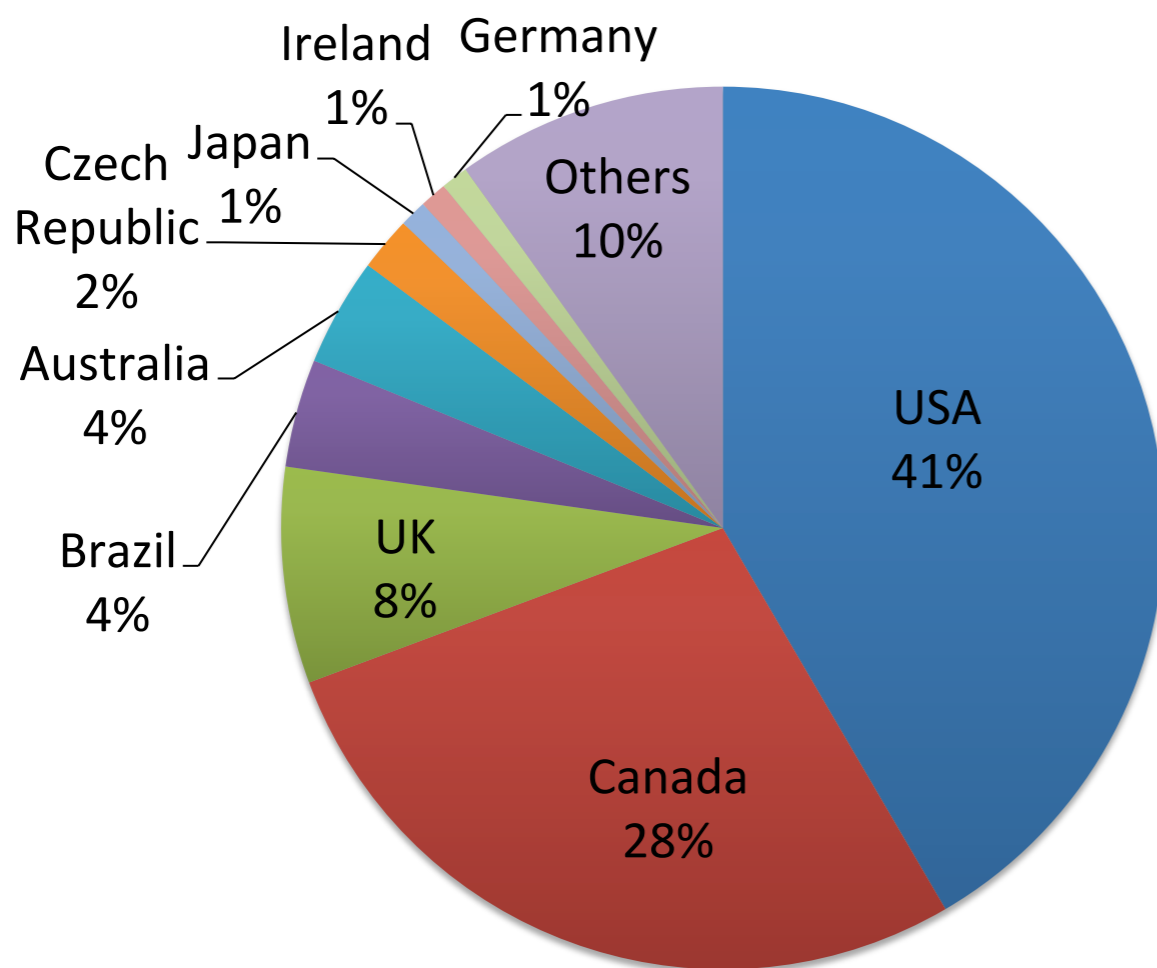


During 2017, APM has published **101** manuscripts, among which there are **59** original articles and review articles.

7. International Diversity of Corresponding Authors in 2017

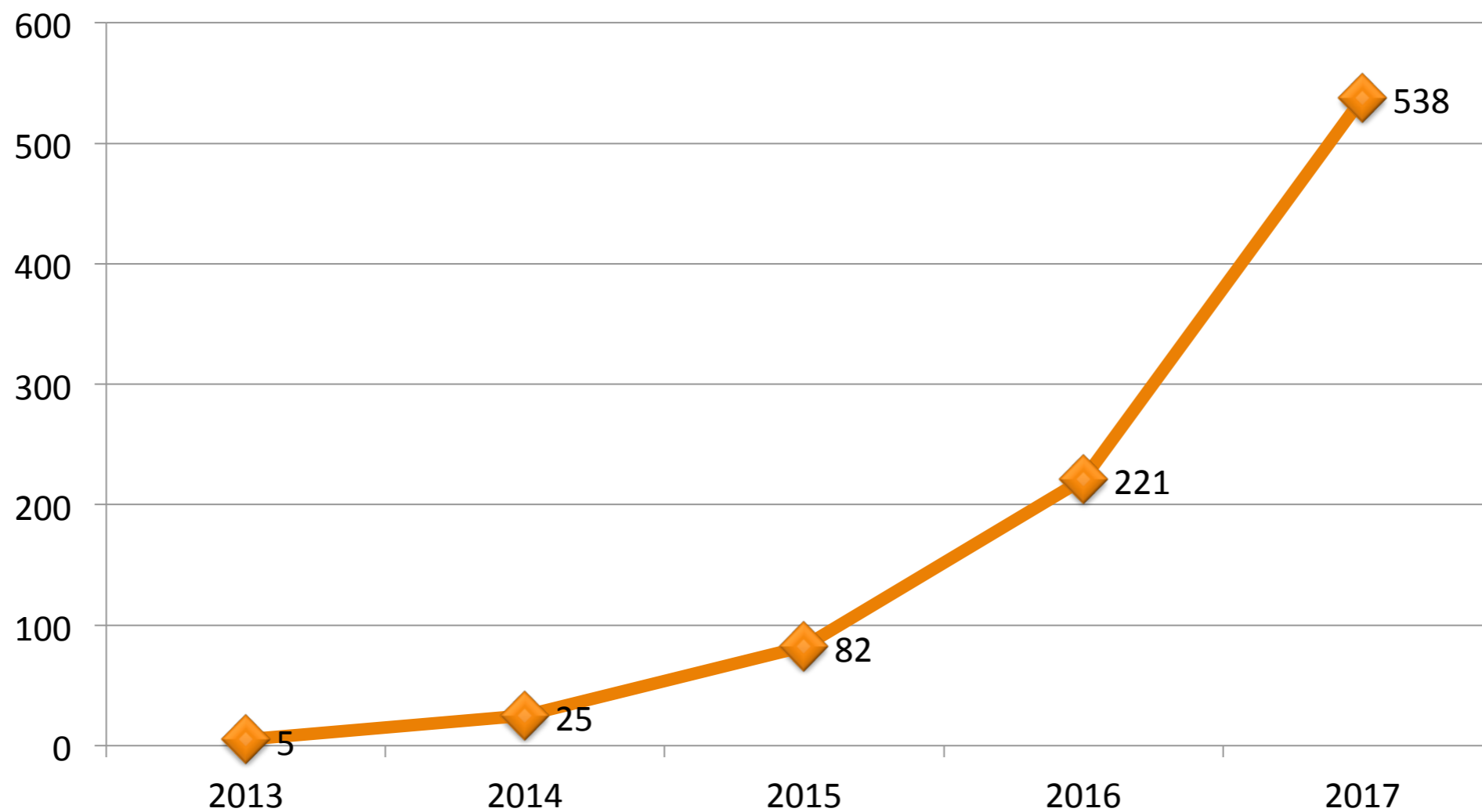


Corresponding authors of **101** articles published in 2017 come from **17** countries, **41%** of them from the USA.

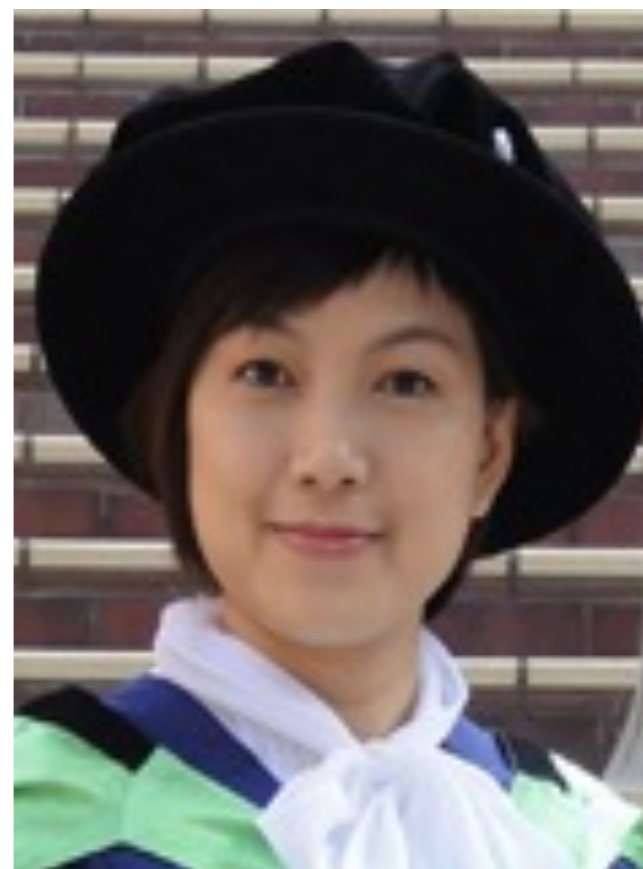

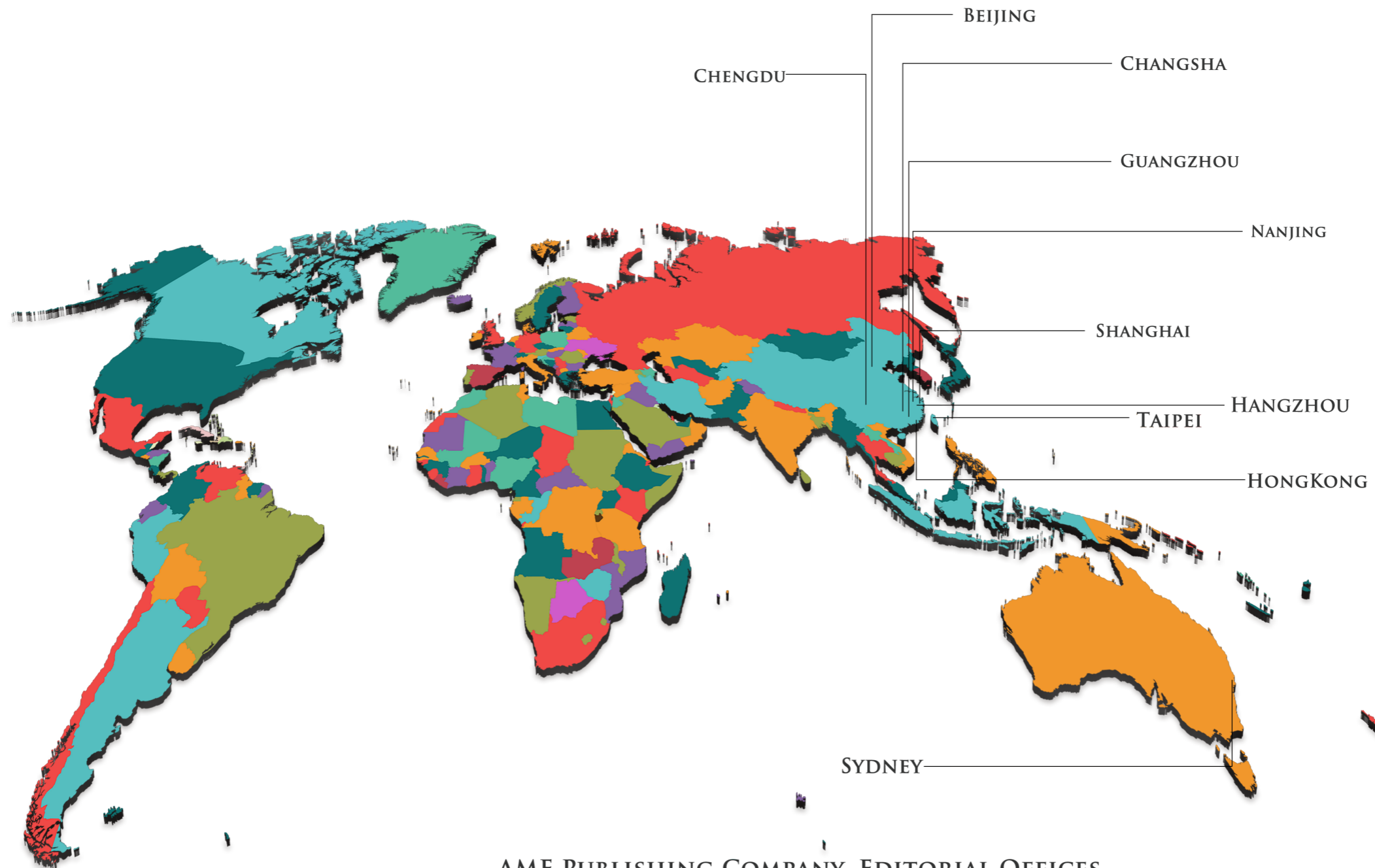
